QUALITY HIGHER EDUCATION: ACHIEVEMENTS AND FAILURE

Education is a vital process for personality development and social change, in the last seventy years after independence, higher education in India expanded remarkably. There is tremendous increase in the numbers of colleges and universities, there is no explosion in number of students, and the caroliteme in higher education has swelled. Today we have separate universities in India for the streams like law, medical science, egipulcaring and technology, agricultural science, agricultural technology and engineering, post harvest technology etc. in addition to the traditional universities. India is regarded as having the third largest reservoir of secentific and technical manapower in the world.

India has made significant achievement in the development of education. The Indian education system was thrown open after undependence to all at all levels rich, poor, middle income classes, men and women, rural and urban population, backward and non-backward segments of the population. Society and a consequence, there has been a vertifiable explosion in number of students, institutions and teachers. There has been the development of institutions of excellence, producing highly speciation human capital it codel producing the second largest at two different and shifted manpower in the world, and the thrid largest reservoir of securities and technical manapower.

What we find in India in that there exists a good number of universities and other institutions of higher education of excellence, at the same time there also exists a large number of institutions of substandard quality. As a result in terms of total quantum of output of our higher education institutions it is one of the largest in the world, the quantum adjusted for quality, and in case of indicators of quality, India does not necessarily rank fairly well with many developed and even developing economics.

India has a large stock of above 7 million science and technology more and ranks third in the World But the myth of the third largest stock of scientific and technical manpower in the World stands exploded if one carefully examines the quality of the manpower.²⁰ The stock is not adequate to match the requirement of the economy.

As high as 89 percent of the enrollment in higher education were made in the first degree, students enrolled in research i.e. 0.7 percent and 0.9 percent in diploma and certificate courses. The research output of our higher education system in India, in terms of its quality does not compare very favorably with
